

May Spiritual Practice - Remember your Baptism, and be thankful!

Dear People of St. Catherine's,

I invite you this month to begin a new spiritual practice, or deepen one that you already practice. Our font is at the entrance of the Nave, and is filled with water that has been blessed. Many of you do this already - if you do I invite you to be more intentional about the prayer and thanksgiving: Upon entering the Nave, stop at the font and dip your finger into the Holy Water. Make the sign of the cross as a way of remembering your baptism, and say a prayer of thanks to God.

These practices take the Holy Spirit seriously – the Spirit's work in our inner lives, and the reality that when we encounter the Scripture with an open heart, the Spirit is there to guide us. Two of the major Feasts of the Christian year are in May this year – **The Feast of the Ascension on Thursday May 10** (50 days after Easter) and **The Feast of Pentecost on May 20**^{th.}

We will have a contemplative eucharist at 7 p.m. on Ascension Day (May 10) and our usual three Sunday services on Pentecost (May 20th) with Baptism at 10 a.m.

Finally, a HUGE thank you to everyone who made our celebration of Baptism, Confirmation, Reception, Renewal of Baptismal Vows, and our celebration lunch such a wonderful experience!! Special thanks to Tiffany Grant and Seth Jones and others who helped put on the barbeque lunch, and to the fearless leaders of the J2A group, Carol Bechtel and Diana Grupposo, who have shepherded this group through the spiritual formation for youth to their confirmation. We had three (adult) baptisms, nine confirmations, two receptions from the Roman church, and one re-affirmation of faith. What a glorious day!!



St. Francis Memorial Garden

Who, What, When, and Where is St. Francis?

St. Francis of Assisi, Italy lived in the eleventh century. He was the patron saint of animals and the environment. He was canonized by Pope Gregory in the thirteenth century and started the order of the Franciscans.

We have a garden named after St. Francis at St. Catherine's. It is on the north side of the old sanctuary. It is a beautiful garden. The garden has been there since the 1970's. It is a place where the ashes of loved ones have been interred over these many years. The

garden is a peaceful quiet place to find solitude. It was a vision of Dot Keating. She designed the garden and the red brick path in the shape of a cross. The statue of St. Francis stands at the back of the garden in front of a brick wall with bronze plaques. The names of the people that are interred in the garden are placed on a bronze plaque on the face of the bricks. At present there are 92 plaques. The basic landscape of boxwood and trees remained about the same over the years. At one time there was a rose garden, but no one was able to take care of them like Helen Strout. At Christmas and Easter, we decorate the Garden with poinsettias and lilies.


Over the years much thought, planning, and commitment has gone into the garden. Different things have been added such as the brick wall for the placement of the plaques, the red brick walkway in the shape of a cross, the black wrought iron fence and gate that surrounds the garden and property behind the wall, and the garden lights.

St. Francis' Garden is a very special place that is reserved for the interment of St. Catherine families and loved ones and a quiet place of solitude and community.

Talk a walk in the garden and visit St. Francis. If the wind is blowing, you may hear chimes, you may see or hear a bird and almost always a beautiful butterfly will join you.

Waves of Grace: An Easter Reflection

When I was about 7 years old, my father taught me to swim in the ocean. I'd had the wind knocked out of me by an enormous wave that rolled me topsy-turvy in the sand and left me tearfully disoriented. My father, a former lifeguard and swim coach, determined that this was the moment to teach me to courageously approach the ocean with the respect it deserves.

As we waded in, my father explained that the way to avoid getting pummeled by the swells is to dive into them. With my hand securely enveloped by his, we waited for the next wave to draw near. "Ready?" he asked. I took a deep, shaky

waters swirled around us. Then, suddenly, my father's strong arms were drawing me up and out onto the other side, and I was squinting in the brightness of the sun dancing on the water, no worse for the wear. I felt relief, and even exhilaration. And then came my father's voice, "Ready to do it again?" The world we live in teaches us to face the waves of life head-on with sheer grit and dogged determination. We are taught to depend on ourselves, to prioritize our security, and to pull ourselves up by

breath, nodded, and with eyes screwed tightly shut, made the plunge. An eternity seemed to pass as the

our own bootstraps. Inevitably, these methods fail us. Knocked down by life, we find ourselves sputtering on the sands of disappointment.

The message of Easter is that God generously offers us another way to engage our turbulent world. Having

The message of Easter is that God generously offers us another way to engage our turbulent world. Having been knocked about by jarring encounters with our own brokenness and the wounds of our world, we emerge from Lent to find Christ guiding us into the waters of baptism.

Submerged in the swirling chaos of the waters of this world, we are baptized into Christ's death. Drawn up out of the waters and into the light, we are baptized into Christ's resurrection life.

Christ's hand reaches out to us, inviting us to abandon our tense posture of fear and self-protection. We can trust Christ to lead us through a world which has not ceased to be turbulent, but is, suddenly and all at once, full of wonder and possibility. With each wave we pass through, we might come to hear the voice of God gently asking us, "ready to do it again?"

Twenty people represented St. Catherine's Episcopal Church at the April 16th HOPE Nehemiah Action held at Bible-Based Fellowship Church. We joined 23 other faith communities in a powerful example of faith in action.

The issues presented and acted upon:

Decent Housing Affordable for Families and seniors - County Commissioners Victor Christ and Pat Kemp agreed to request that county staff would be asked to identify a viable funding mechanism to dedicate \$10 million annually for affordable housing and report

back to the Board of County Commissioners thirty days after the April 18th meeting. They also agreed to make a motion any the end of August 2018 directing County staff to develop the ordinance to establish a Hillsborough Affordable Housing Trust Fund. HOPE leaders will meet with Victor Christ in August to check progress on the ordinance. Jeff Eakins, Superintendent of Hillsborough County Schools spoke briefly in support of a Housing Trust Fund calling it "critical".

Increased Access to Elder Care - HOPE wants Hillsborough County to increase the number of seniors receiving the Basic Care Plan to meet the needs of the current and growing senior population in our county. We also want the County to routinely track and report on the number of seniors receiving specific services, so the community can monitor and understand how elder care needs are met. County Administrator Mike Merrill's response to the above requests were somewhat disappointing. He did not think he could deliver a promise to increase the number of seniors receiving a Basic Care Plan by an additional 500 by September 2019. He also was not in favor of publishing the number of seniors receiving the Basic Care Plan and the number of seniors served broken down by service and priority level on the county website. He thought the September 2019 deadline was too tight and that the published list would be difficult to keep updated. HOPE will continue to meet with Mr. Merrill to work on a solution.

Civil Citations for Children to Stop Arrests - HOPE helped get a bill passed requiring all Florida counties of set up juvenile diversion programs and officers to document all cases when not offering a civil citation. The bill also encourages counties to set up civil citation programs for adults and ensure Florida releases regular accountability reports so people can be treated fairly regardless of where they live or the color of their skin. For the Nehemiah Action HOPE asked law enforcement leadership to support expanding our county's Civil Citation program so officers can issue civil citation for second and third misdemeanor offenses and misdemeanor family on family domestic violence. Public Defender Julianne Holt, Chief Judge Ronald Ficarrotta, State Attorney Andrew Warren, County Sheriff Chad Chronister and Tampa Police Chief Brian Dugan agreed. When asked if they would work out logistics to provide a safe temporary place as needed for children and implement these policy changes by September 1, 2018 all agreed except the County Sheriff and the Tampa Police Chief who wanted more time to look at the data.

Well over a 1,000 people attended the 2018 Nehemiah Action HOPE for Justice!
